

Tips for Teaching Elective or Core Learners in a **Busy Clinical Practice**

It is important to provide both elective and core learners with meaningful and rich learning opportunities that are also manageable for you as a clinical teacher. The learner experience should focus on their personal learning objectives and the core elements of the discipline to which you want to expose them.

Preceptor Objectives



Share opportunities and challenges to make learner placements a valuable experience.



Show how your discipline and practice are socially accountable and adapt to the needs of the communities and populations you serve.



Assign meaningful projects to learners during any clinical down time.

Supporting Learners Through the Stages of a Clinical Placement

· Meet with your team to clarify learning options for the learner and provide the team with the learner's background information. Before Arrival • Review safety protocols. Establish how you will schedule patients to accommodate the learner. Provide the learner with an orientation, a dedicated workspace, and the tools they need. Establish clear expectations and plan how to meet specific learner and discipline objectives. On Arrival Review the schedule and establish guidelines on how to manage virtual and/or in-person visits. Discuss educational activities that will aid the learner. Consider drafting an educational plan or learning contract. Clarify time expectations for patient visits. • Establish when the learner should touch base with you. Daily Debrief at the end of the day to review daily successes, provide feedback, and outline the plan for the following day. • Select specific patients in your practice best suited to meet the learner's needs and discipline objectives. Weekly

End of placement

- Consider brief weekly check-ins to discuss learner progress and
- identify new opportunities for learning in upcoming weeks.
- Complete required evaluations and review with the learner prior to their departure.
- Ask learner for feedback on their experience and your teaching.
